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FACULTY FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM: ANALYSIS REPORT 2017-18

Feedback of 10 Faculties on curriculum was collected during the academic year 2017-18. The result of the responses received from the faculties is analysed and the details of the same is as under:

- Out of total 10 faculties 6 (60%) opined that the structure of the curriculum framed for the various programs is very good and remaining 4 (40%) opined that it is good.
- 2 (20%) of the faculties are of the opinion that the sequences of the courses provided in the curriculum is appropriate - excellent, 6 (60%) opined that is very good and remaining 2 (20%) were of the opinion that is good.
- 1(10%) of faculties believe that the depth of the syllabi for the courses are in relation to the competencies expected by industry/current global scenarios thus excellent, while 2 (20%) believed it is very good, 6 (60%) believed it is good and remaining 1 (10%) believed it is average.
- 2 (20%) of the faculties were of the opinion that the sequence of the units/modules in the courses is excellent, 2 (20%) said it is very good, 3(30%) opined it is good and 1 (10%) rate is as an average.
- The distribution of credits to the courses is equal. 7 (70%) of the faculties rate it as very good, 2 (20%) as good and 1 (10%) as an average.
- 5 (50%) of the faculties rated that the adequateness of textbooks and reference books mentioned for the courses is very good, 4 (40%) as good and 1 (10%) as an average.
- The potential of the students in understanding the course objectives is rated very good by the 8 (80%) of the faculties and 2 (20%) as good.
- 2 (20%) of the faculties rated that the syllabus content for the courses is burden on students.
- 1 (10%) of the faculties believed that the contribution of the courses is in terms of Professional core area that is excellent, 1 (10%) rated it as very good, 6 (60%) as good and 1 (10%) as an average.

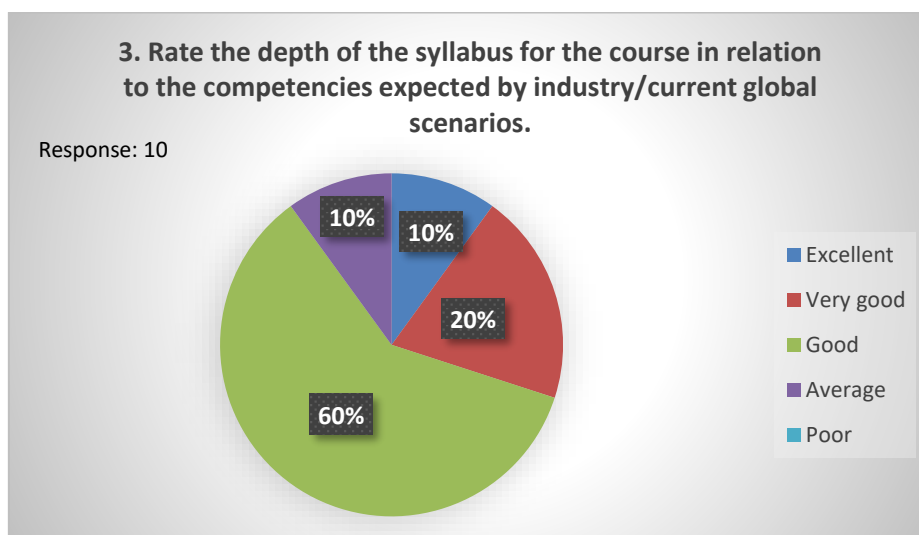
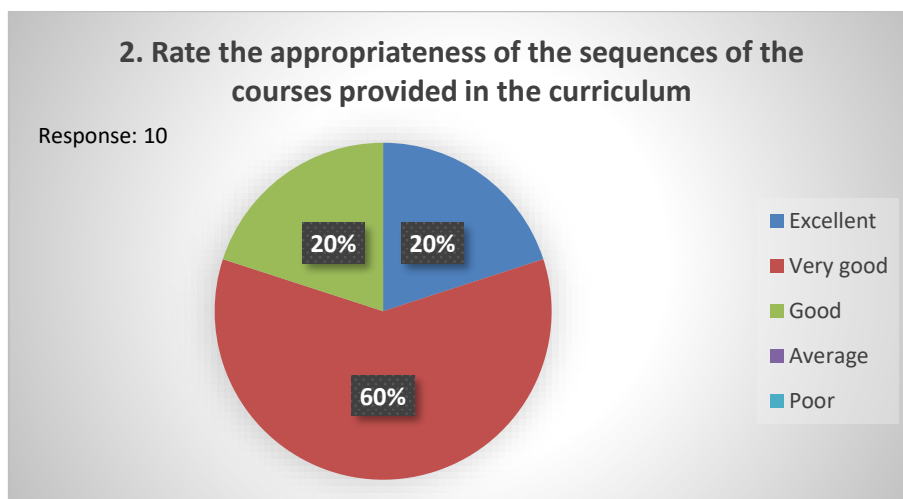
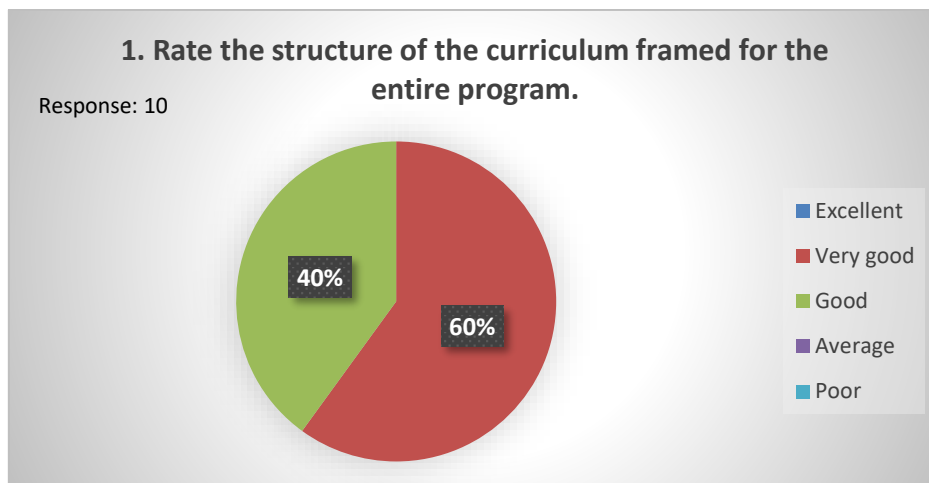

4. On regular basis suggestions and inputs will be taken with regards to emerging trends in various areas and the same will be incorporated in syllabi & curriculum.



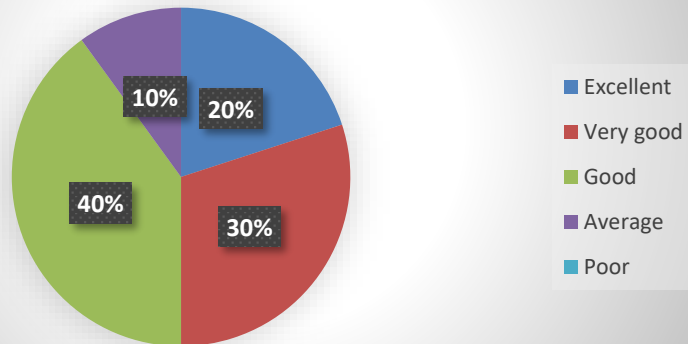

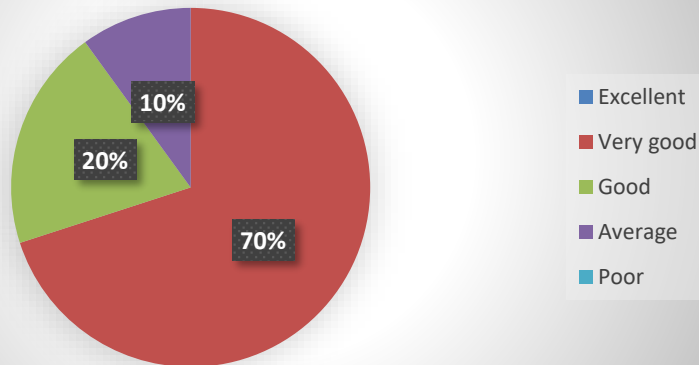
4. Rate the sequence of the units/modules in the course

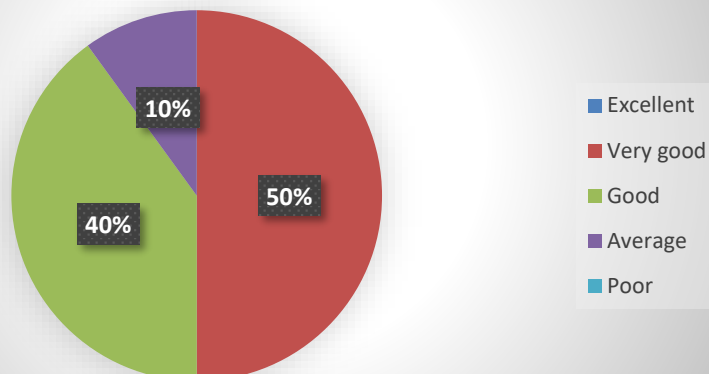
5. Rate the distribution of credits to the course

Response: 10



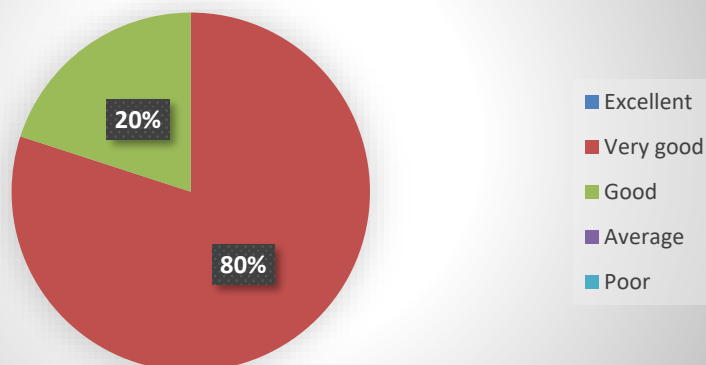
6. Rate the adequateness of textbooks and reference books mentioned for the courses.

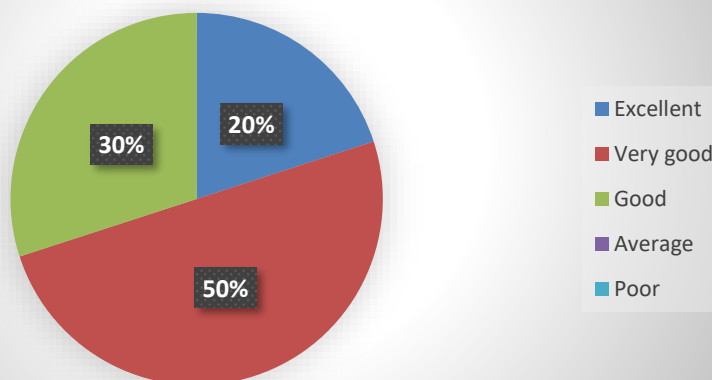
7. Rate the potential of the students in understanding the course objectives

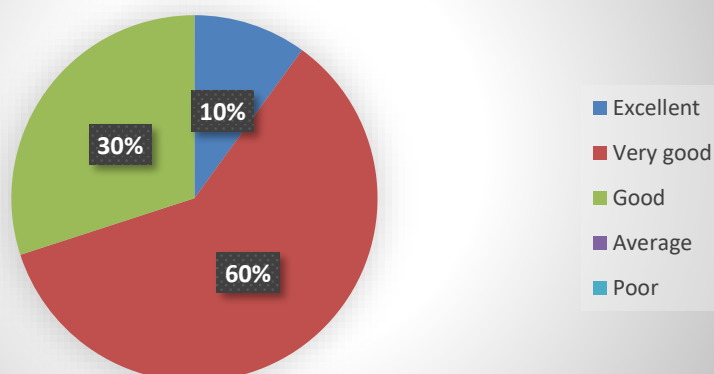
8. Rate the syllabus content for the courses in terms of burden on students

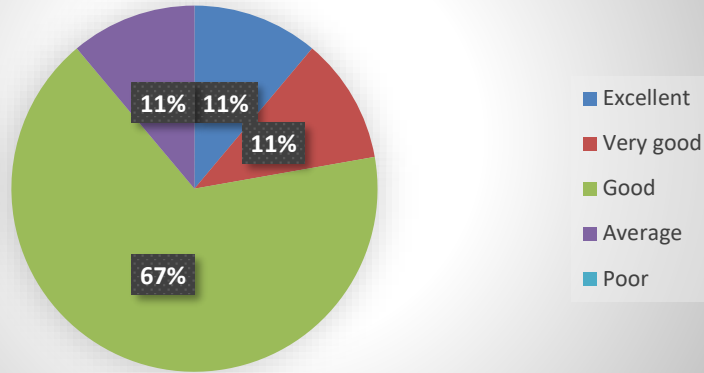
9. Rate the experiment list in stimulating the interest of students in the subject.
